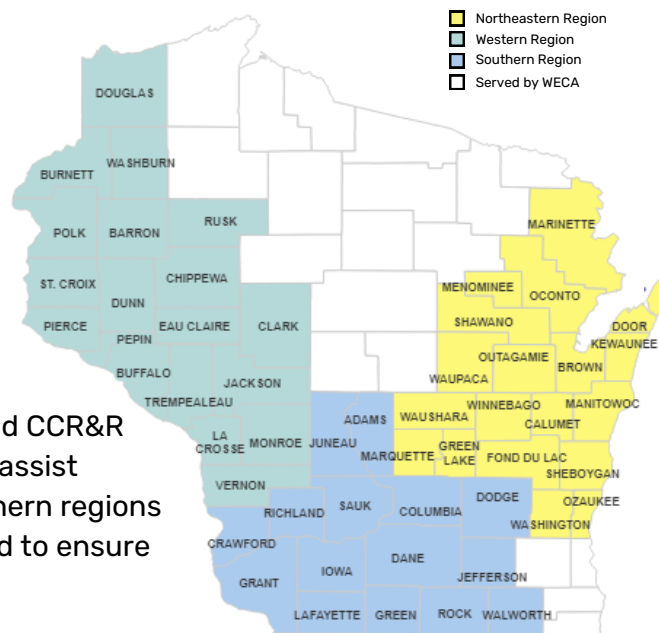

What is Child Care Pre-Licensing?

Pre-Licensing is a required free service for people interested in starting either a licensed family child care or group child care center in Wisconsin. 4C and CCR&R Network Pre-Licensing Technical Consultants will assist individuals in the Northeastern, Western and Southern regions from start to finish as you prepare for licensing and to ensure you understand and meet the licensing rules.



Personalized start-to-finish support

4C & CCR&R Network Pre-Licensing Technical Consultants will meet with you regularly to cover all the topics needed to get started:

- Understanding licensing rules, procedures, and steps to become licensed
- Physical space requirements and equipment needed
- Guidance to navigate and complete DCF forms, application, and other documentation
- Coaching and resources to successfully operate a child care business: budgeting,
- financial recordkeeping, marketing and family recruitment, creating policy manuals, etc.

Additional DWD support*

- Essential business materials and equipment
- Coverage of initial licensing fees

- Parent referrals through your local Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) Agency
- Eligible for reimbursement for meal expenses through the Child & Adult Care Food Program and county child care subsidy payments
- Local CCR&R ongoing professional development support and resources
